3.1. Resolution #20-10-3-489 Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) Aquatic Center Grant – Staff intends to apply for this grant to provide water sports equipment, safety instruction, youth scholarships, and improvements at Paradise Lake. This grant funding source is well-matched with the expansion of our water sports programs for Paradise Lake and beyond. Paradise Lake

Report in Brief

Staff intends grant to apply for the Boating and Waterways (DBW) Aquatic Center (http://dbw.parks.ca.gov/?page_id=28817). The mission of DBW is to provide safe and convenient public access to California's waterways and leadership in promoting the public's right to safe, enjoyable and environmentally sound recreational boating.

As part of its mission, DBW manages the Aquatic Center Grant Program to enhance boaters' knowledge of boating laws, practical handling of vessels on the water, weather and water conditions, rules of the road, equipment requirements and environmental stewardship. Funding is provided to local public agencies, nonprofit organizations, and colleges and universities operating within California that offer on-the-water training to the general public.

This grant funding source appears well-matched with our expansion of water sports programs at Paradise Lake and beyond.

Eligible equipment includes sailboats, trailers, water ski boats, canoes, kayaks, rafts, stand-up paddle boards (SUPs), windsurfing equipment, boat engines, safety boats, and associated safety equipment, such as life jackets, radios, wetsuits, and associated portable equipment such as storage sheds, equipment racks and portable docking systems. All equipment must be portable for the grant. Scholarships and safety events (potentially tied in with the kid's fishing day) are also eligible. Life jackets must be worn by all participants during any training paid for by grant funds or when using any vessels purchased with grant funds.

If awarded, staff anticipates utilizing these funds (NTE \$40,000) to purchase water sport equipment, a floating dock, and to provide youth scholarships in support of instruction (including boating safety education), rentals, and youth programs.

This funding source came to staff attention last week, and the Deadline to submit the application is 12:00 p.m. on October 30, 2020.

SUBJECT: Community Power Resiliency Grant for PSPS Events for Special Districts

Report in Brief

Staff intend to apply for the Community Power Resiliency Grant for Special Districts in the State of California. The grant is offered through the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES). Cal OES is funding projects that will enable Special Districts in critical infrastructure service sectors to prepare for, and continue operations during, Planned Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) events. This grant funding source covers 100% of project equipment required to ensure continuity of service during PSPS events. Proposals may not exceed \$300,000 and there is \$20 million budgeted to fund the grant proposals.

If awarded, staff anticipates utilizing these funds (NTE \$300,000) for the following equipment:

- Purchase of a clean-energy generator to power the Terry Ashe Recreation Center (TARC) Offices and restrooms (TARC is considered critical infrastructure as it is the home of the District and as one of the few Warming/Cooling centers on the Ridge);
- Installation of a manual cut-over from PG&E power to the generator system;
- Fuel storage system and fuel for the generator;
- Portable battery-powered and rechargeable radio repeater and transmission equipment to serve as redundant emergency communications; and
- Portable vehicle-mounted charging stations.

This funding source came to staff attention last week, and the Deadline to submit the application is 5:00 p.m. on October 30, 2020.
