Regular BOD Meeting - August Highlights

Paradise, August 11, 2022 – The Paradise Recreation and Park District Board of Directors met for their Regular Meeting Wednesday evening at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center.

Anna Bauer (Director, First Five Butte County) presented information about upcoming efforts to aid young children and their families on the Ridge, with emphasis on the Magalia area. Bauer discussed possible future collaborations with PRPD children living in District.

The meeting also featured presentations from Recreation Specialist Lori McCoslin and Recreation Coordinator Willie Davidson. McCoslin described the success of the summer preschool program and the kids' Pinewood Derby. Davidson detailed the events happening at the Moore Road Ballpark, such as the Men's and Coed Softball leagues, and the merits of the new lighting at the Ballpark.

In new business, the Board reviewed and accepted the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 audit. Auditor Holly Pladson, CPA presented the findings to the board and noted a "clean" report with 2 management findings. Staff noted that the management findings have already been corrected.

The Board also received an update on potential real estate transactions.

Chair Al McGreehan adjourned the meeting to the next Board of Director's Meeting on September 14, 2022 at 6:00 pm at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center.
