PRPD Honors Resigning Director

September Meetings Highlights

Paradise, CA, September 24, 2025 – The Paradise Recreation and Park District (PRPD, District) Board of Directors (Board, BOD) convened for its Regular Monthly Meeting on September 10, 2025, and a Special BOD Meeting on September 18, 2025, at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center.

The Board and staff recognized and acknowledged Board Member Mary Bellefeuille for her 9 years of service to the District. With her resignation, the District will be appointing another Board member to fill the 5th Director seat.

At the Regular Meeting, Program Director Kelly Munson presented updates to the Elements program, and Recreation Supervisor Scott Amick provided a summary of the Spring Valley Summer Camp.

Staff presented an agreement with Yuba Community College District (YCCD) to provide leadership and outdoor experiences to YCCD staff and students. The Board authorized the fee for service program agreement.

The BOD directed staff to finalize transfer agreement with the Paradise Community Center (PCC). This property transfer is one of the last hurdles prior to the PCC's (formerly the Paradise Senior Center) re-opening to the public post Camp Fire, which will likely occur by the end of the year.

The next Regular Board of Directors Meeting is scheduled for Wednesday October 8, 2025, at 6:00 pm at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center. Community members are encouraged to attend.
