## PRPD Board of Directors Meetings

### June Highlights

Paradise, CA, July 19, 2023 – The Paradise Recreation and Park District (PRPD, District) Board of Directors (Board, BOD) conducted two meetings this month, its Regular Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, June 14, 2023, and a Special Meeting on Monday June 28, 2023, both at Terry Ashe Recreation Center.

The PRPD Final Budget for the 2023/2024 Fiscal Year was presented to the Board for consideration and approval. District Manager Dan Efseaff briefed Board members on items related to salary scale, wages, and grant income. The BOD discussed the items, and then after hearing public comment, the BOD approved the 2023/2024 Fiscal Year Final Budget.

Recreation Specialist Lori McCoslin was recognized for serving 30 years as a District employee. The Board of Directors and Staff expressed their appreciation for McCoslin’s work and efforts within recreation in the District as well as being an integral part of the community.

The Butte Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) requested that the District vote for a Special District “Enterprise” Member for the vacant LAFCO position. The Board of Directors deliberated and decided to vote for Scott “Kent” Fowler of the Feather River Recreation and Park District.

The next Regular Board of Directors Meeting will be held at Terry Ashe Recreation Center on August 9, 2023, at 6:00 pm.
