Regular Board of Directors Meeting

January Highlights

Paradise, CA, January 17, 2023 – The Paradise Recreation and Park District (PRPD, District) Board of Directors (Board) met on Wednesday January 11, 2023 at Terry Ashe Recreation Center for the Regular Monthly Meeting.

District Accountant Catherine Merrifield provided informational updates to the Board about the Budget Calendar for the 2023-2024 Fiscal Year.

The District passed a resolution accepting a planning grant with the State of California to explore recreation opportunities and impacts for Off-Highway Vehicles (OHV) at Jordan Hill Road Park. This grant funding allows for further research on OHV impacts and protection measures for drinking water sources, wildlife, soils, and habitat, and for identifying potential measures for appropriate recreational activities.

Recreation Supervisor Jeff Dailey updated the Board with the 2022 Season Pool Report for both the Paradise and Concow Pools. Supervisor Dailey noted the necessity for replacing the heater/boiler for the Paradise Pool before the 2023 Pool Season, as well as the future need for lifeguard hiring incentives and training.

The Board accepted the Standing Committee assignments for the Personnel, Park and Recreation, and Finance Committees as well as a proposed schedule and agenda order.

Lastly, Staff presented District updates on programs, activities, and parks/property happenings to the Board for the month of December, including grant opportunities for youth and community offered by the District.

The next Regular Board of Directors Meeting will be held at Terry Ashe Recreation Center on February 8, 2023, at 6:00 pm.
